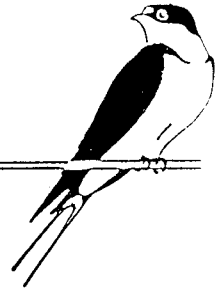
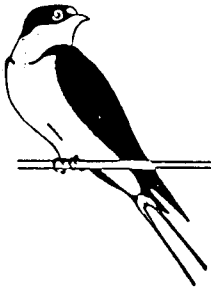
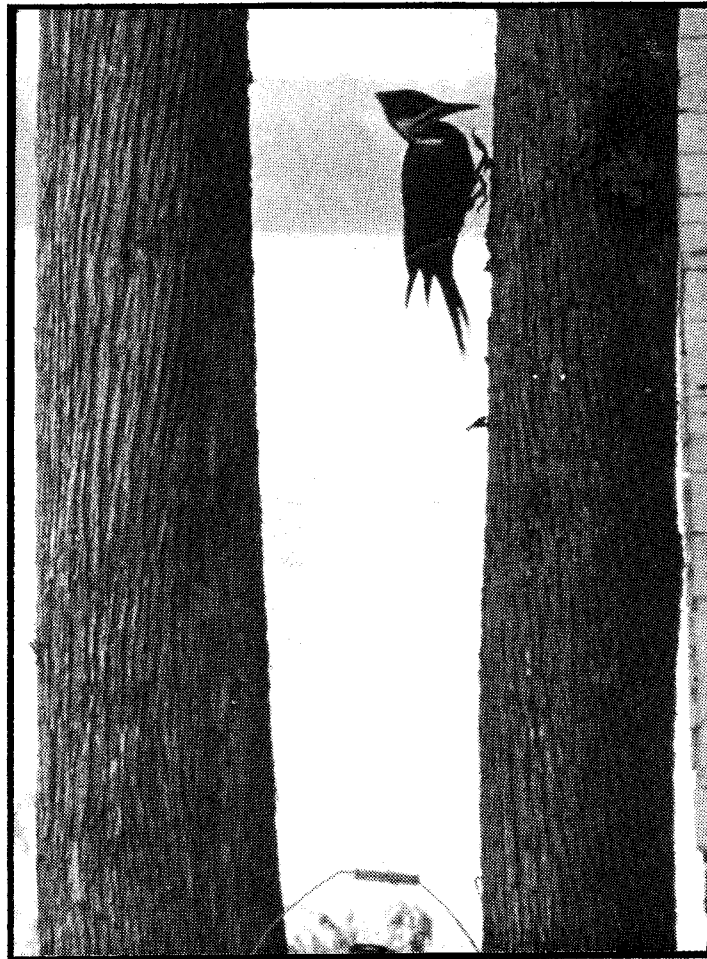

This parking area is at the bottom of the only hill going south from Rankin. This date is the absolute peak of Spring migration when the most numbers of species can be seen. Red-breasted Mergansers and Oldsquaw are possible as well as, gulls, terns and songbirds. Don't be sorry and harbour later regrets!
